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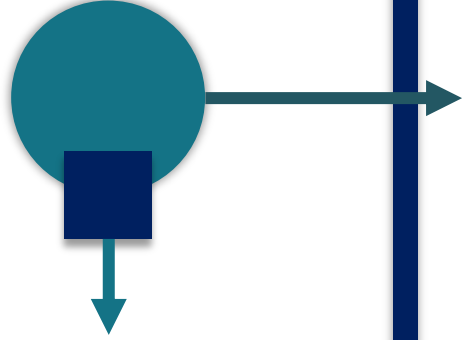

- “My name is ...”

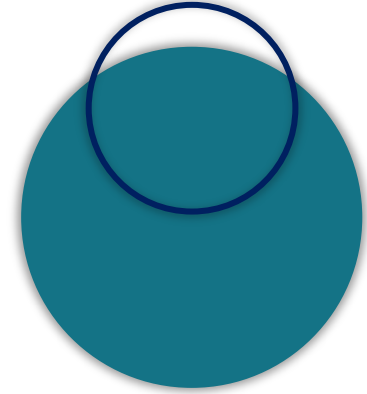

Where are you from?	Min Ayna Anta?	مِنْ أَيْنَ أَنْتَ
I am from ...	Ana min	أَنَا مِنْ ...

بِرِطَانِيَا      آلْهِنْدُ      بَا كِسْتَانُ

# Nouns



In Arabic, there are two types of nouns: Masculine & Feminine

- How do we know which one is which?
  - Note: most feminine nouns have ة at the end of the word
  - For example:

أَرِيكَهُ حَدِيقَهُ دَرَّاجَهُ

(Masculine)



English	Transliteration	Arabic
This is	Haazaa	هَذَا
What?	Maa	مَا؟
What is this?	Maa haazaa	مَا هَذَا

English	Transliteration	Arabic
That is	Zaalika	ذَلِكَ
What?	Maa	مَا؟
What is that?	Maa zaalika	مَا ذَلِكَ

English	Arabic
This is a camel	هَذَا جَمَل
This is a donkey	هَذَا حِمَار
This is a horse	هَذَا حِصَان
This is a cat	هَذَا قِط
This is a dog	هَذَا كَلْب
This is a bed	هَذَا سَرِير

English	Arabic
That is a camel	ذَلِكَ جَمَل
That is a donkey	ذَلِكَ حِمَار
That is a horse	ذَلِكَ حِصَان
That is a cat	ذَلِكَ قِط
That is a dog	ذَلِكَ كَلْب
That is a bed	ذَلِكَ سَرِير

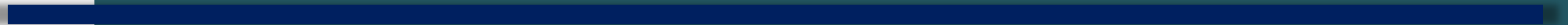
