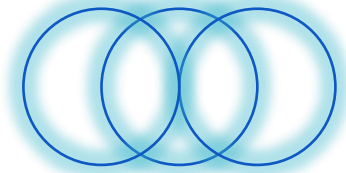
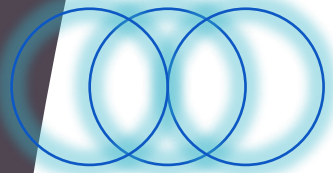
Arabic: The Mother of all Languages
